THE SCHOOL CAMPUS

The senior school site is situated on the Lower mall. The sprawling campus includes a four storey instructional block. The Nursery Wing, the Preparatory Wing and Junior Wing are located in a separate building, equipped with modern amenities. As per the CBSE direction, the school has a Math Lab and a fully functional English Lab. THE JOURNEY TO SUCCESS IS FILLED WITH CHALLENGES BUT REWARDS ARE WORTH IT



BDPS, Patiala proudly greeted **Rajbirinder Singh** (alumnus Batch 2014), who has secured All India Rank **780** in the prestigious **UPSC Civil Services Examination 2024**. In a special ceremony at the school, he was felicitated by honourable President, Mrs Sukhvinderjit Kaur and Principal, Mrs Harpreet Kaur with a trophy and bouquet as a token of appreciation. His parents and close friend Piyush, who supported him throughout, were also recognised with a thoughtful gift of honour.

Rajbirinder addressed the students, candidly sharing his journey. He described himself as an average student academically but very active in extracurricular activities. After school, he pursued a degree in Software Engineering at Thapar University and worked at the MNC BlackRock. Despite the stability of a corporate career, he felt unfulfilled. This led him to commit to preparing for the civil services—a challenging journey that spanned 5–6 years.

He spoke honestly about facing setbacks. In his first attempt, he cleared the mains and reached the interview stage but failed to make it to the final list. In his second attempt, he again couldn't make it past the interview. These experiences, he said, felt like climbing to the top of the ladder only to fall back. Yet, with the encouragement of his family and lifelong friend Piyush, he persevered and in his third attempt, he succeeded.

IN CONVERSATION WITH SUCCESS



During an interactive session with the School Council, he shared several valuable insights:

- **When discussing how to handle interview pressure:** He described it as a crucial 30-minute period which would decide if he was going to win or fail . He also mentioned that the questions were high-level and unpredictable, requiring sharp presence of mind.
- **Dealing with the urge to give up:** He admitted that he did feel like quitting, but he chose to identify and correct his mistakes instead. He added that the constant support of his family and friends also kept him going.
- **Time management:** He busted the myth of 18-hour study days, emphasising consistency over intensity, and recommended balancing studies with activities like yoga.
- **Advice to students:** He stressed that personality matters, encouraging everyone to engage in extracurricular activities and explore as much as possible.

The event concluded with his heartfelt wishes for the bright future of all the students of BDPS leaving everyone inspired by his story of resilience, humility, and determination.

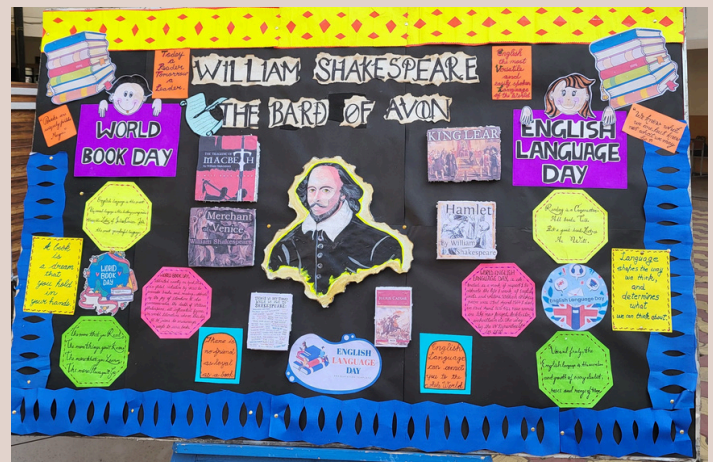


ENGLISH WEEK

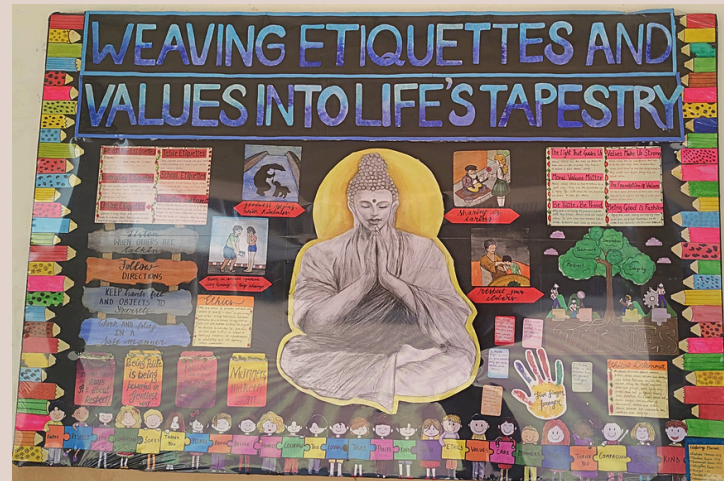
