Baba Guru Nanak Dev ji (1469-1539) was born at Talwandi, which is now Nankana Sahib in present-day Pakistan. From a young age, he showed a lack of interest in worldly matters and focused on spiritual qualities. He travelled widely before establishing a permanent center at Kartarpur on the river Ravi.

At this center, he established a system of regular worship that involved the singing of his own hymns. His followers, regardless of their former creed, caste, or gender, ate together in a common kitchen known as langar. The sacred space he created for worship and meeting was originally called Dharamshala, which is now known as a Gurdwara. Guru Nanak insisted that the worship of one God and true devotion were the only paths to salvation.

The waves reached heights of 20 meters and speeds of 800 km per hour, causing massive destruction in Indian coastal areas like Tamil Nadu.
